Educators and employers agree: High school is no longer enough. In coming years, close to half of all U.S. jobs will require more than high school but less than four years of college—and most will involve some sort of technical or practical training.

This fall, CEFA, the Construction Education Foundation of Alabama, is offering High School Seniors the opportunity to enroll in a Plumbing, Pipefitting or Ironworking Trade Training class for ONLY the cost of books, \$250.00 (normally \$3,800 or MORE). That includes nationally recognized NCCER credentials, hands-on training and job referrals.

Classes are scheduled to start in Sept & Oct

What do I need to do to participate?

- ⇒ You must commit two nights a week for 20 weeks to attend the training classes. Training is generally Monday/Wednesday or Tuesday/Thursday 5:00 to 8:20.
- ⇒ You must write a 500 to 1,000 word essay on why you want to participate.
- ⇒ You must provide a recommendation from your High School Guidance Counselor
- ⇒ You must come to the CEFA Training Center and complete an application in person. Applications are taken Mon–Fri at 9:30 a.m. or 1:30 p.m. High School Students are allowed to call and schedule a special appointment at 4pm if needed.
- ⇒ You must have \$250.00 on or before the first day of class for books.



Plumber *

Plumbers assemble, install, or repair pipes, fittings, or fixtures of heating, water, or drainage systems, according to specifications or plumbing codes.

Pipefitter *

Pipefitter lay out, assemble, install, or maintain pipe systems, pipe supports, or related hydraulic or pneumatic equipment for steam, hot water, heating, cooling, lubricating, sprinkling, or industrial production or processing systems.

Ironworker *

Ironworkers raise, place, and unite iron or steel girders, columns, and other structural members to form completed structures or structural frameworks. May erect metal storage tanks and assemble prefabricated metal buildings.

CEFA High School Senior Scholarship Training Program

If you are a High School Senior and want a jump start on a career in a construction trade and the inside track for employment in the industry you should consider participating in industry sponsored training. If you are selected to participate you will receive 160 hours of trade training, a nationally recognized credential and employment referral in the trade.

What does it cost? CEFA is asking any student selected to pay for the books (\$250.00) used in the training. ALL additional training costs are covered.

The scholarship funding is for training in Pipefitting, Plumbing or Ironworking. Exceptions may be granted for Electrical, HVAC, Carpentry and Welding based on availability. Each one of these trades is listed by the labor department as having a “bright outlook” for employment. There is also a solid demand for new employees in these trades.

General Program information: Classes are held two nights a week for 3.5 hours. The class is about 70% theory and 30% hands on. Actual class start dates are still being determined... but most will start mid-September or early October.

Selection Process: Selection will be based on the following; essay, high school counselor recommendation, transportation, and prior technical training.

Transportation: You must have transportation to and from class, show up on time and have someone to pick you up at 8:20 after class if you are not driving.
